Back to the project texts:

There are many activities to support tourism of those who come to pay homage to Phrabuddha Chinraj, for instance keeping small Buddha-image and sacred-stuff shops; freeing-bird-tortoise; and in addition light and sound activities.

3. Methods of spraying for cotton enemies must be investigated - the technology utilized in spraying at present is out of date and costly both in terms of amount of insecticides used and labour requirements. Furthermore, farmers are put into a dangerous condition as they are in the midst of the spraying as well as causing pollution to the environment, besides insects developing resistance.

Good quality insecticides must be identified, without putting farmers into a more dangerous condition. It is suggested here that spraying should be done only when there is contamination and spreading of contagious insects to reduce costs and pollution. Farmers must count insects in the field. Absurd. Once the number of insects reach a certain limit (like what?) spraying can be done. Counting of insects must be done at least twice a week, or once a week because ⁱⁿ more than 7 days, the disease can spread and sprayers will not be effective (the research team should try this before recommending it to the growers, who have better things to do).

Farmers must learn about the diseases the insects and all the worms involved (Should they be so well learned, they would not be growers in the first place) and spraying of different kinds of insecticides together with the method of counting insects will reduce the number of times (so why grow cotton in the first place?) needed for spraying ie. 2-6 times a season depending on the spread of diseases or insects. This means that farmers can reduce costs of spraying at 180-468 $\text{P}/\text{rai}/\text{time}$. How is this guesstimate obtained? Table 3.4.1-10 compares cost of spraying using the old and new method.

The Dept. of Agric Promotion had developed a project promoting large scale cotton cultivation. It emphasizes on the prevention of cotton enemies or protection of cotton enemies in 19 provinces, totalling an area of 450,000 rai.

VN renegades kidnap a cow

Prachin Buri — Villagers living near the border paid a ransom of 600 baht cash and a Citizen wristwatch to Vietnamese troops who had kidnapped a cow.

A military officer in Aranyapathet District said the payment was made at 1.30 p.m., two and a half hours after the cow was abducted.

He said three Vietnamese troops split from a main patrol group and swam the Prom Mahod Canal which separates Thailand and Kampuchea.

The intruders, he said, headed for Wang Morn village and made off with the cow, belonging to Chan Sri, 26.

After negotiations between a village headman and the Vietnamese, a ransom demand for the cow's release was made.

The officer said this was the second time Vietnamese troops came into the area for the purpose of stealing. The first was on June 22.

● MONKEY business is always good for some amusing headlines in South and Southeast Asia. A couple of months ago *The Statesman* of New Delhi reported that monkeys had besieged a police station and fought a long battle with the cops to rescue a baby monkey, which had sneaked into a prison van parked by the cop shop and was tucking into some potatoes inside it, when a sentry crept up and slammed the door.

The lively account continues (and it is best read aloud with a slight Indian accent): "The trapped baby created such a hullabaloo that within minutes a gang of monkeys collected. While their leader jumped atop the van, the others sat on the wall, blocking the entrance to the police station. The situation took a turn for the worse when a policeman hit the leader of the gang with a stone. A fight ensued between policemen armed with lathis and guns and the monkeys. But the simians stuck to their guns. The police later decided to release the trapped monkey. Cautiously the door was opened. The baby jumped out and the monkeys left with their young one."

The report left unexplained what guns the simians stuck to.

● OVER the border in Bangladesh, a cry for help was contained in a recent letter to the editor of the *New Nation* from Md Ahsanullah of Dhaka. (Again, this is best read aloud in a Bengali accent.) He wrote:

"Monkeys have become a chronic problem in Gandaria they come in a group and snatch away food, vegetables and fruits from different households. If they fail to get foodstuff, they take away utensils and whatever they can lay their hand on. The notorious monkeys even torn clothes kept out-side for drying in the sun. The pedestrians and hawkers become easy targets of their attack. But the notoriety of the monkeys are not limited there. They make obscene gestures particularly at womenfolk. It is very difficult for women staying home alone at daytime. If the excursions of the monkeys are not stopped immediately, people of this area will always feel insecure and at adds to live here. We urge the Dhaka Municipal Corporation to take immediate steps to save the people from such an undessirable situation."

● OVER in Africa, Swaziland's national newspaper, *The Swazi Observer*, revealed recently in a front-page spread that the boot is on the other foot on that continent:

"Three families in Nhlngano have been thrown out of their homesteads after they were allegedly found riding baboons in the middle of the night at Ngelane area. They were thrown out on witchcraft suspicion." Appa-

rently the families were spotted taking their "joyrides" and duly evicted from their homes — though the article did not explain why such severe action should be taken against them or indeed why riding a baboon should be regarded as practising witchcraft. Still, it made an unusual headline:

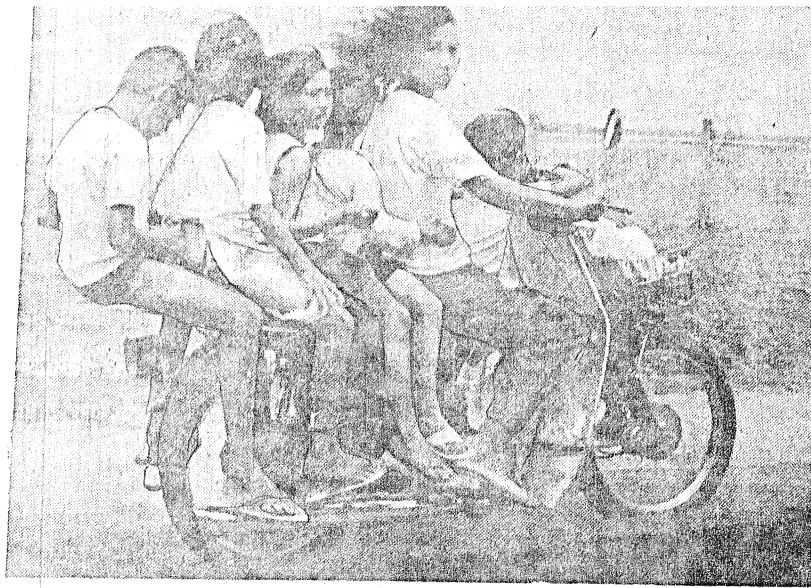

SO now we have piranha in massage parlours. The mind boggles. Just imagine, a weary businessman sitting in the bath minding his own business (and very nice she is too) when suddenly a piranha roars out of the plughole. Nothing to defend himself with but a bar of vitamin soap. Just one bite and it could be all over. Nasty.

I cannot help but think that these fearsome fish have been infiltrated into the massage parlours by the same women who have driven their husbands to drink in the home. Clearly these ladies will stop at nothing to keep their man in his place. Is no man safe?

Wonders of the Deep

THERE is a small aquarium in our household, but there's nothing as exciting as a piranha in it. In fact it could well be the most boring aquarium in Bangkok. Certainly the fish look bored stiff, but then they are hardly the most stimulating of specimens. There's a red one with acne that only emerges at feeding time, a couple of ugly orange things with what looks like terminal fin rot, and assorted nervous grey creatures which, I suspect, have serious psychiatric disorders.

Terror on two wheels

A colleague over at CBS News has made some observations about Bangkok's motorcycling cowboys which he has kindly passed on to me. Here is his "Guide for the new motorcyclist in Bangkok."

Mirrors: These should be folded inwards to aid your passage through dense traffic. Their primary use is for pimple-picking at traffic lights. They should never be extended outwards, in which position the images of overtaking traffic could distract the rider.

Muffler: A quaint *farang* term for the chrome extension on an exhaust pipe. This should not be mistaken for the megaphone you have attached to your exhaust, a contest for which was recently held...first prize; one red sticker, second prize; one yellow sticker etc.*

Maintenance: Only to be carried out while on the move, usually when at 8,000 revs in second gear, away from the lights. Should consist of raising right leg and peering at spark-plug while approaching traffic jam at 60 mph.

Two stroke: Type of motorcycle engine, honed to perfection in Thailand where oil is mixed with gasoline to lubricate engine and to provide a dense smokescreen to any imaginary traffic policeman who might be interested in the number on your non-existent license plate.

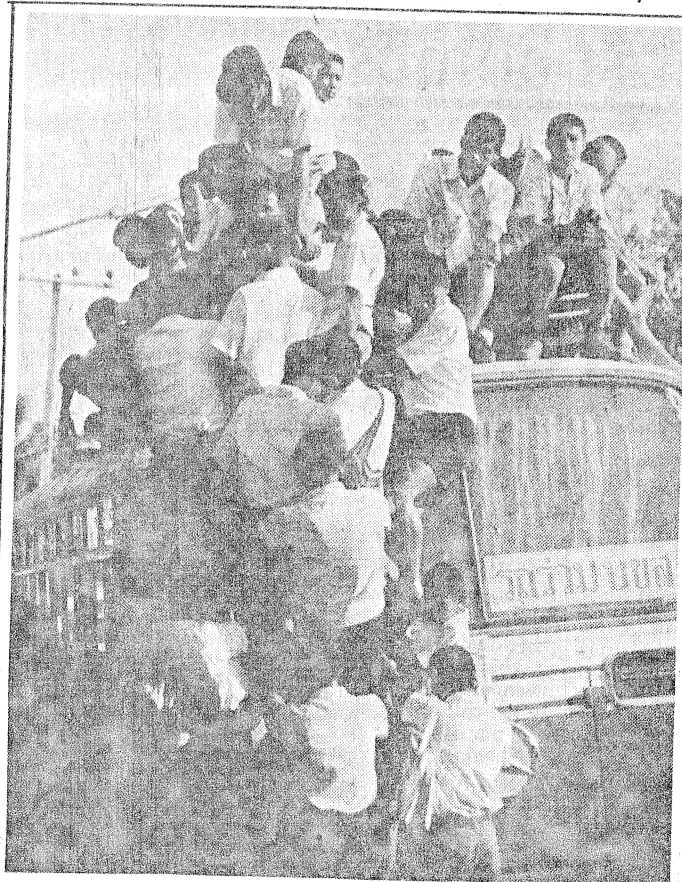

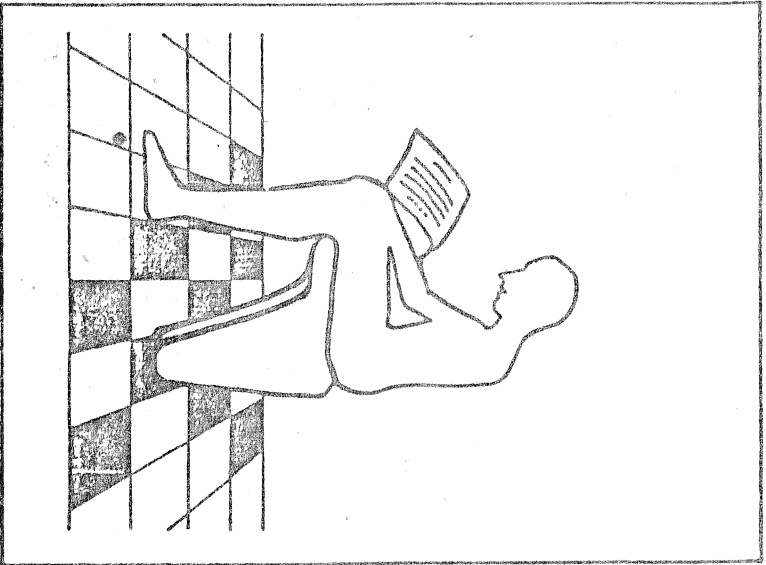

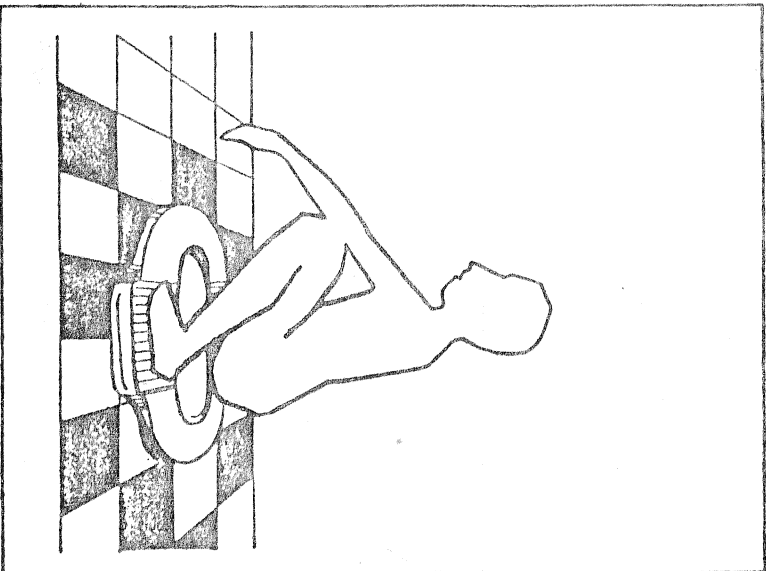

**Year of the
dead rat**

THE Year of the Rat in the Chinese calendar may be proving a difficult year for rats. As part of a government anti-rodent campaign, China's first cat farm has produced 2,400 rat-catchers to prevent rats from consuming the nation's grain, the official Xinhua news agency reported Wednesday. The farm was set up last year in Changling county, Jilin province, by former schoolteacher Liu Guocheng, 22, the report said.
